

Places to visit in the Area

Locally there are many good restaurants and welcoming public houses serving food. The nearest pub is the Red Lion at Lowick Bridge (2 miles) and the Royal Oak at Spark Bridge is 3 miles away. The nearest restaurant is the Wilsons Arms at Torver (3 miles), a pub with a separate dining room. All are renowned for good food and reasonable prices.

BRANTWOOD

Home of John Ruskin (6 miles).

CARTMEL

Famous for its Priory and National Hunt horse racing at spring and autumn Bank Holidays (11 miles)

CONISTON

Nearest large village, well known for its old copper mines and made famous by Donald Campbell.

GRANGE OVER SANDS

Small estuary town.

GRIZEDALE FOREST

Huge forest, famous for its Theatre and the Silurian Way with Gallery, Café and Sculpture Trails in the forest.

HAWKSHEAD

Charming old village with plentiful souvenir shops and a Grammar School attended by William Wordsworth.

HOLKER HALL

Home of Lord and Lady Cavendish, venue for regular functions throughout the summer such as Horse Trials, Hot Air Ballooning, Car Rallies, Country Fairs etc.

MUNCASTER CASTLE

Open to the public with beautiful grounds, Owl Sanctuary with birds being flown each day.

SAWREY

Home of Hill Top, Beatrix Potter's cottage (11 miles).

SKELWITH BRIDGE

Slate works, waterfall and nice Tea room (10 miles).

STOTT PARK BOBBIN MILL

Working museum close to Lakeside.

TARN HOWS

Area of outstanding natural beauty (9 miles)

ULVERSTON

Old market town with a charter from 1280 (8 miles).

And of course the magnificent Lakes,
Fells and Mountains.

Activities in the Area

FISHING

On the River Duddon for Sea Trout and Salmon, permits available from the Old Kings Head, Broughton.

GOLF COURSES

Grange-over-Sands (2) Ulverston Windermere

STEAM YACHT GONDOLA

Unique steam boat, beautifully restored, which sails passenger trips on Coniston Water (6 miles).

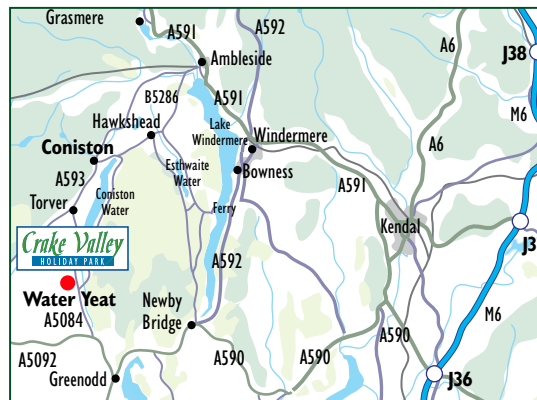
HORSE RIDING

Bigland Hall (near Haverthwaite) (10 miles), Torver (3 miles) or Coniston (5 miles).

A small private steam railway connecting with steamers on Lake Windermere (8 miles)

How to Find Us...



From the North leave the M6 at junction 40 taking the Keswick A66 road. Follow either the A592 Ullswater and Kirkstone Pass road or the B5322 and A591 Thirlmere and Grasmere route to Ambleside. Take the A593 to Coniston and Torver. Turn left at Torver onto the A5084, where the park is on the right after 3 miles.

From the South leave the M6 at junction 36 taking the Kendal road for 3.5 miles. Turn left onto the A590 Barrow road and continue for 16 miles to Greenodd. Turn right onto the A5092 Workington road and within 2 miles fork right onto the A5084 for Coniston, the park is on the left after 3 miles.

Crake Valley is a small family run holiday park with a maximum of ten static holiday caravans and five timber lodges, all maintained in first class condition, set in lovely peaceful surroundings.

The Park is situated in an elevated position above Coniston Water and the adjoining Old Man of Coniston mountain and fells. The Park opens up onto Blawith Common, which is an extensive area of wild and craggy moorland where you can wander at will. The park is sheltered on three sides by mature oak trees and the lake is just 400 yards away.

We have a small laundry room equipped with a washing machine, dryer, spinner and iron. Guests are requested not to erect washing lines but discreet drying racks are provided. There are also two upright freezers with a drawer for each static caravan to provide extra freezer storage.

Due to the size of the park a shop is not provided, the nearest ones being at Coniston and Greenodd, both five miles away.

Milk and papers can be ordered on the booking form in advance.

There is a pay telephone kiosk on the park for the convenience of our guests.



Lodges

We have five timber lodges, 4 two bedroom and 1 three bedroom, all comprise of lounge, dining room with french windows, kitchen, two or three bedrooms and shower/toilet room. The lounges are comfortably appointed with a three piece suite, coffee table, gas fire, colour television and DVD player, Alpine table and chairs complete the dining area. The kitchens include full sized cooker and grill, fridge/freezer, microwave, all crockery and utensils. Pillows, duvets, blankets and bed linen are included.

Caravans

All our caravans are modern (we introduce some new ones every year) and are completely self contained with electricity, gas heating, hot and cold water, shower and flush toilets. All main bedrooms are equipped with an electric heater and each lounge has a colour television and DVD player. We have 7 two bedroom and 3 three bedroom caravans. All caravans have a fully fitted kitchen with a full sized cooker and grill, fridge, microwave, a range of cutlery, crockery and kitchen utensils are included together with pillows, duvets, blankets and bed linen.

Camping

We have a small flat area separate from the holiday park for tents and trailer tents under the 28 day rule, there are toilet and shower facilities. The camping area is secluded with direct access to Blawith Common.
